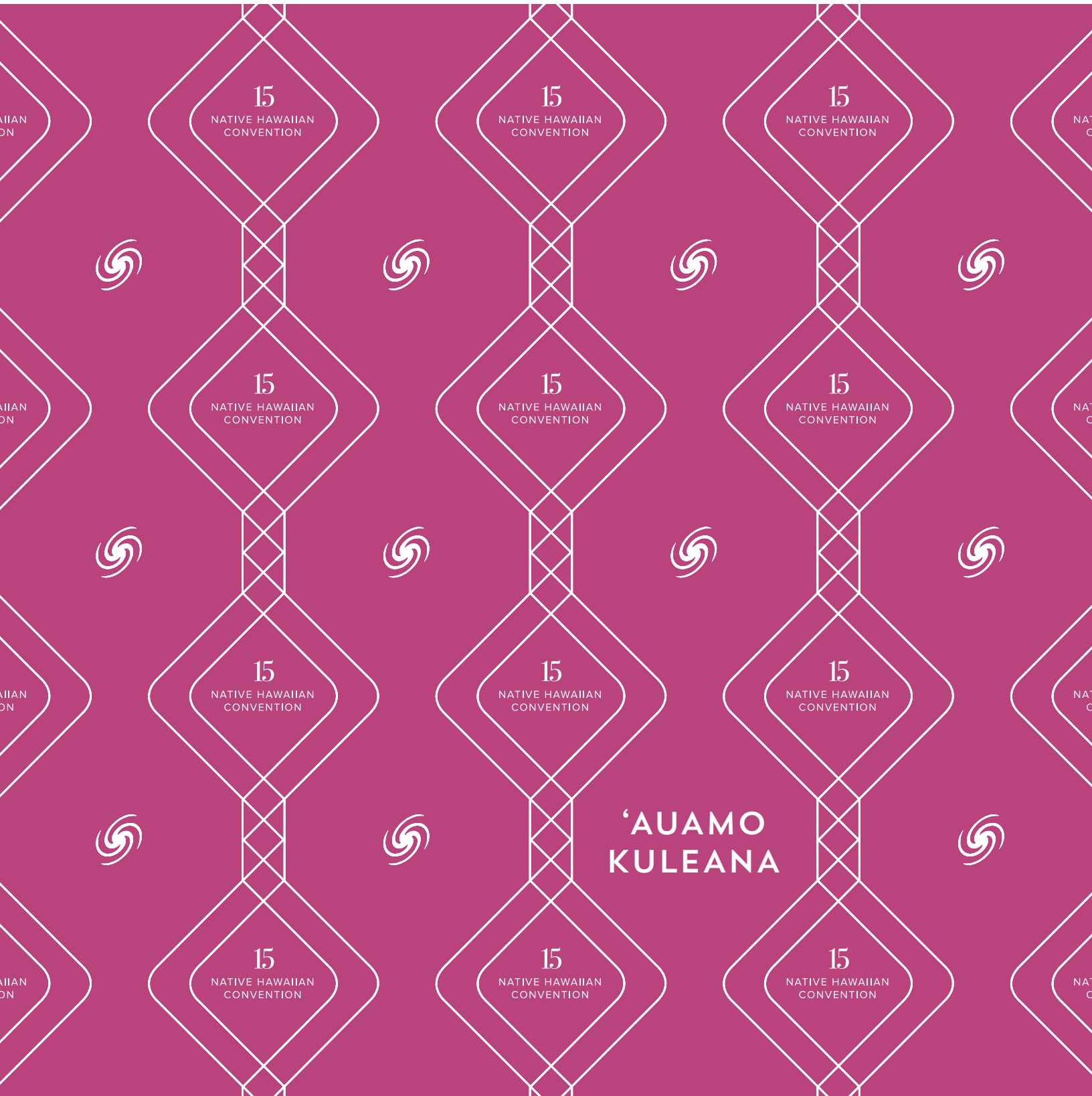

The Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement (CNHA) organizes the Annual Native Hawaiian Convention to focus on public policy issues, sources of funding, and capacity building of Native organizations, homestead associations, civic clubs, nonprofits, and businesses.
